And yes, all I could think was like dad we found out we offered to go down by George Floyd honestly, just because just like the madness that was going on starting fires people breaking into everything you know, usually from cars, flipping cars, you know, it's a difference if you if you break in cars and stuff out here then in Santa Monica, or like Fairfax in Beverly Hills, you know out there, they they really own it. You got you got cameras on you got white people on you got police on you over here and probably you bring someone over here it's gonna take the least 30-45 minutes to come out and look it. We started with all we did was step foot out there and they were surrounding us.

Do you feel like the local authority made the situation worse?

Of course, of course, because we initially went out there for a peaceful protest and then once the police started, you know having a like Chang gang thing where you can't where the crowd can't pass this line right here. That's when everything just got chaotic.
